Neighborhood Security

By and large Forest Glade Estates is a very safe neighborhood, as was recently confirmed by Livermore Police Detective Michael Trudeau and Sargent John Reynolds at our August board meeting. Crime in Livermore is low by regional standards and our neighborhood is particularly low in crime. In addition to their watchful eyes, the city has assigned two officers to our area in town. You can contact them directly with any concerns. They are

Even so it is everyone's responsibility to be on the lookout for crime and safety concerns. Two topics for discussion this month are homeless encampments in the Arroyo and mail theft. Homeless encampments in the Arroyo are a chronic issue for Livermore and can lead to localized crime. If you spot an encampment then contact LPD dispatch non-emergency number at (925) 371-4987 and they will take action. The officers notify the encampment residents that they have 3 days to pack up and leave and monitor progress. While this is not a cure-all it does put the transient population on notice that they are in violation of the law. We are warned there may be a spike in Arroyo encampments this fall when a major encampment by Home Depot will be evicted, sending the residents looking for new places to live.

We have had some instances of opportunistic mail theft this year in the neighborhood. Your best defense is to bring in your mail promptly. Mail is taken from a mailbox and often tossed close by, missing any valuable pieces. One way to combat this is to lock your mailbox. It will at least deter casual mail theft. Several homeowners have installed padlocks on their mailboxes that the mail carrier locks after the mail is delivered. Another option is to install a USPS approved locking insert into your mailbox. One insert that fits our boxes and installs with a single bolt is the small size found at this link. You can see it installed at 1733 Old Tower Rd.
